- What is an advocate?
  - ▶ A person who speaks or writes in support or defense of a person or cause.
- What makes a "good" advocate?
  - A person who is willing to show support for themselves and/or others.
  - A person who shares their story.
  - As an international education professional you are qualified to speak as a private citizen about the experiences and needs of your students.
  - Be wary of speaking on behalf of your institution, organization, etc.



- How To Be Successful
  - Share a story
  - Share facts, data, and supporting information as a follow-up
    - Supporting facts are crucial and can often be persuasive, however, without a memorable story or example they can often be forgotten.
  - Be clear and concise
    - You may only have 15 minutes to meet with an elected official and speak about large, complex issues.
  - Ask for something concrete
    - Examples: Funding, passage of legislation, verbal support



#### NAFSA Advocacy Platform

- Immigration: Create a fair immigration process with a roadmap to earned citizenship and more green cards for graduates to enhance U.S. innovation and competitiveness.
- DREAM Act: Allow undocumented students who were brought to the United States as children the opportunity to go to college, get a job, and contribute to our society without fear of deportation.
- International Student & Scholar Mobility: Welcome international students and scholars who bring academic, cultural, and economic contributions to schools and communities.
- Study Abroad: Expand and diversify opportunities for Americans to gain the foreign language and cross-cultural skills necessary to be competent in a global economy.
- Senator Paul Simon Study Abroad Program: Incentivize colleges and universities to make study abroad an integral part of higher education.
